### **Title: Early Childhood Performing Arts Teaching Artist for Outreach Program**

**Summary of Position:** The Early Childhood Outreach Teaching Artist will teach weekly pre-school multi-performing arts- based classes for ages 3-5 years with the ability to add younger ages if needed. The teacher will have the ability to incorporate music, movement and creative dramatics into weekly lesson plans. This teaching artist will also serve as a teacher-trainer for a developing early childhood teacher using a student teacher model. The ability to collaborate is key to the success of the position. Children in the program will experience process-oriented instruction geared towards multiple learning styles in an inclusive environment that embraces all aspects of age- appropriate development of creativity and expression.

- Embrace universal design for learning principles; embrace multiple learning styles
- Communicate effectively with colleagues at the partner site
- Provide feedback and hands-on learning opportunities for student teacher partner
- Use your own talents & background to add creativity and uniqueness to classes
- Communicate process improvement measures to the Artistic Director
- Participate in bi-weekly coaching sessions with Artistic Director
- Be an active, knowledgeable and visible ambassador for MRPAC as it relates to the current and upcoming performances, gallery shows and organizational history

- Experience working in a team-teaching and/or student teacher mentor scenario
- Coachable life-long learner who is willing to embrace professional development
- Commitment to cultural competency practices related to diversity, equity & inclusion

- Builder of positive workplace relationships
- Possesses excellent interpersonal communication skills
